

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

The **Doctor of Education** degree requires that graduate students complete a residency requirement. Two options are available for completing the residency requirement at this level.

At the doctoral level, graduate students may fulfill the residency requirement by one of the following:

- ___ Option A Complete 2 consecutive semesters or 2 consecutive summers earning a minimum of 9 credit hours each semester or summer session.

- ___ Option B Complete 3 academic terms (semesters or summer terms) during a 24-month period earning a minimum of 6 credit hours per term.

During the period of residency, Ed.D. candidates will be expected to participate in a variety of scholarly activities over and above their classes. Such activities should be documented and many include presentation of papers at professional conferences, attending special lectures and seminars, preparing manuscripts for publication, or writing grant proposals.

TRANSFER OF CREDIT POLICY

Grambling State University's graduate programs in developmental education offer a liberal transfer of credits policy. Credits for courses in which candidates received grades of "A" or "B" from a regionally accredited institution, may be transferred providing that they are not more than six years old and that their content is validated as being current. For the Doctor of Education degree, a minimum of 66 hours of credit beyond the master's is required of which a minimum of thirty-six must be completed at Grambling State University.
