Master of Public Administration

The Master of Public Administration (MPA) program complies with the standards set by the National Association of Schools of Public Affairs and Administration (NASPAA). The program was awarded accreditation in 1997 by the Commission on Peer Review and Accreditation (COPRA) and is listed on its Annual Roster of Accredited Programs. The program provides graduate degree opportunities for individuals from diverse backgrounds. Evening classes are offered to facilitate the enrollment of in-service professionals.

Program Mission and Objectives

The mission of the MPA program is to prepare individual for administrative careers in federal state, and local government service, as well as other organizations in the public sector and non-profit arenas and to provide graduate degree opportunities for individuals from diverse backgrounds.

The major objectives of the program are to:

- To provide students with intellectual insights, critical perspectives, professional competence, and analytical tools crucial to their understanding of the field of public administration;
- To provide training and education in public policy making and administration; human resource management; administration and organizational theory; budgeting and finance; and research methods;
- To offer in-service practitioners the opportunity to strengthen their analytical and problem-solving skills in order to support their career advancement.

- Public Management.
- Health Service Administration.
- Human Resource Management.
- State and Local Government.

Graduation Requirements

A student must meet all requirements for graduation as established by the School of Graduate Studies **and** meet the following MPA program requirements.

- 1. Complete 45 hours of graduate credit with a minimum GPA of 3.00 ("B") which must include 27 hours of required MPA program courses.
- 2. Pass a written comprehensive examination following the completion of 30 hours of graduate credit hours including the 18 hours of core courses and at least 9 hous of concentration courses. Eligibility requirements to take the comprehensive examination are set forth in the Comprehensive Examination Guidelines. Students may exercise the Master's Thesis option in lieu of taking the comprehensive examination.
