Through approved curriculum redesign in the late 1990s, LSP evolved and achieved national accreditation in October 1986 by COA/AALR. LSP was the first accredited program located at an HBCU. Throughout the years, accreditation has been reaffirmed. During Spring 2013, a national consultant was contracted to help develop strategies to improve student NCTRC test performance.

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



Assessment data indicate that students in the LSP are learning and applying knowledge of the scope of the profession, historical, philosophical, and scientific basis of practice. Ninety percent achieved the target rate in the entry-level course for therapeutic recreation, while 80% achieved the target rate in the entry-level course for general recreation. See link. Eighty-five percent of students received a 70% or higher on their portfolio assignments within the LSP program and 80.85% achieved 70% or higher on exams. Additionally, 92.59% of students passed the Level Test III Comprehensive Examination. Furthermore, five students attended the state LRPA conference, while an additional five attended the state LAPHERD conference.
