EDUCATIONAL LEADERS CURRICULUM

EDLD 500 Visionary Leadership and School Management - provides in-depth knowledge of the skills needed to develop, implement, and articulate school vision, mission and goals to all stakeholders.

EDLD 501 Legal Aspects and Ethical Issues – provides candidates with fundamental concepts of American school law and its application to real school settings

EDLD 502 Using Data in Instructional Leadership – prepares educational leaders in the understanding and use of statistical techniques to collect, analyze and interpret data.

EDLD 503 Curriculum Design and Development – provides a framework for investigating issues and trends related to curriculum development.

EDLD 504 School-Community Collaborations – provides candidates with skills to analyze and interpret various models of school-community organizational frameworks and to develop collaborative skills for communicating with community, school and public policy-makers.

EDLD 505 Organizing the Learning Environment – provides candidates with the knowledge and skills to secure and use resources to support instruction and improve student learning.

EDLD 506 Instructional Improvement and Assessment – focuses on the ability to identify best practices in instruction and assessment; evaluation and school improvement.

EDLD 507 Using Research to Lead Change – provides an integrated approach to the methods and procedures for educational and social science research.

EDLD 508 Human Resource Management –examines the educational leader's role in managing the human resources of the school to facilitate teaching and learning.

EDLD 509 Evaluating Program Effectiveness – prepares school leaders to apply techniques for evaluating the effectiveness of educational programs.

EDLD 510 Internship –engages candidates in problem-based field experiences in school settings under the supervision of a mentor.
