<u>First-Time Freshman</u> - An entering freshman who has never attended any college (or other postsecondary institution). Includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended college for the first time in the prior summer term. Also includes students who entered with advanced standing (college credits earned before graduation from high school).

<u>High Ability (Summer Program)</u> – The <u>High Ability Program</u> is a summer program offered to rising high school seniors (juniors going to 12th grade) who are academically talented. The participants will earn college credits and experience college campus life. For details about the program, call 318-274-6141.

<u>Undergraduate Transfer</u> - if you have enrolled in a regionally accredited institution since graduating high school you are considered a transfer student.

Re-Admit Student—if you previously attended Grambling State University and have not attended for at least one regular semester, and you have not enrolled in another institution since last enrolled at GSU, you are considered a re-admit student.

<u>Former/Transfer Student</u> –if you previously attended Grambling State University, and have attended another college since last enrolled at GSU, you are considered a former/transfer student.

<u>Non-traditional Student</u> – if you are a degree-seeking student 25 years of age or older, you are considered a non-traditional student.

<u>Transient (Non-Degree Seeking)</u> - A student who intends to enroll in one or more courses at Grambling State University, but whose home institution is another campus is considered a Transient (or Visiting Student).

<u>Organizational Leadership</u> – Select this application type if you meet the qualifications to enter the Organizational Leadership Program. For program requirement, visit <u>Organizational Leadership Program Overview</u>.

<u>New Freshmen International Students</u>: If you are not a United States citizen or do not have a Permanent Resident Card (Green Card), you are considered an international student. Please visit the Center for International Affairs & Programs for detailed admission information.
