☐	CEU – HON 0001 Provost Leadership Camp I (Ages: 10-12) <i>Provides learners with the necessary keys to strengthen leadership skills. Methods to increase reading, writing, speaking and other skills essential for success will be discussed. The students will shadow a campus mentor for a day and have a reflection period with their respective mentors. Movies and games will be used to identify skill sets to strengthen leadership skills. Students will be introduced to various cultures and increase soft skills. Additionally, they will shadow a campus mentor for a day and have a reflection period with their respective mentors. ☐	CEU – SC 001 Fabric Art and Handmade Vintage Craft Day Camp <i>This is a three-day hands-on camp with a duration of three hours per day. Participants will complete two fabric art projects that can easily be taught to children from preschool age to adults and can be used for a host of decorating ideas at school, church, and home. Also, the fabric art projects make for great handmade gifts. The instructor will introduce, demonstrate, and display projects that are vintage handmade crafts and will take more time and equipment to complete than will be allowed at camp. Some of the other handmade projects include but are not limited to: Kentucky heritage bears, Mississippi beautiful dolls made from everyday socks, Virginia friendship collars, Kentucky and Colorado chicken scratch/snowflaking embroidery projects, Georgia crochet items, Kentucky strung beads, Louisiana friendship bracelets, Kentucky and Mississippi quilted items, and more handmade items for a genuine crafter's exhibit. ☐	CEU – SC 002 Coding and Robotics Workshop (Ages: 8 – 16) <i>This camp will provide an introduction to how a computer works and the instructions that it executes to perform meaningful tasks. Campers will learn how to structure instructions for the computer and will see their instructions being executed in the SCRATCH programming environment which is a visual tool for learning programming. Campers will then modify and program their code to the FITCH robot. They will continue to modify and reprogram their robot based on feedback from the robot's execution of the desired tasks. Campers will also become familiar with the various sensors and actuators on the FITCH robot and how they can use them to design their own tasks. Campers will then learn about the basics of electrical circuits and how they can translate their new skills to programming embedded computers. At the end the campers will present one of their programs for the FTICH and one of their programs for the embedded computer. Each attendee will receive lunch during the camp, a camp T-shirt, and an embedded sensors kit to continue expanding their skills after the camp.</i> Lunch is included. ☐	CEU – SC 003 Introduction to Embedded Computing and the Internet of Things (IOT) (Ages: 12 and older) <i>Embedded computers are the type with the largest distribution. These dedicated function computers are used in almost every device such as cars, medical equipment, household appliances, toys as well as mobile devices. These computers accept input, perform some arithmetic or logic and output a result.</i> <i>The Internet of Things (IOT) is an emphasis to provide the resources to gain information from and control of electronic devices. These resources include network connectivity, security and web platforms.</i> <i>This course covers the fundamentals of programming the Arduino microcontroller with the ESP8662 WIFI module. Interfacing various sensors with the embedded computer will be covered as well as interfacing Relays, displays and other external circuits. ☐	CEU – SC 004 PLC – Programmable Logic Controller Workshop (Ages: Open) <i>This workshop seeks to equip the attendees with skills to get jobs in controls and automation. These skills can also be applied using platforms other than PLCs. This course will introduce programming logic controllers and their applications. Attendees will learn how to design ladder logic diagrams to implement desired functions. They will also use RS Logix 500 software to design ladder logic for the Micrologic 1200 Allen Bradley PLC. Projects will utilize various input and output and attendees will learn how to interface various sensors and actuators with the PLC. The workshop will also cover pneumatic and Hydraulic circuits and to design logic to control these actuators.
