

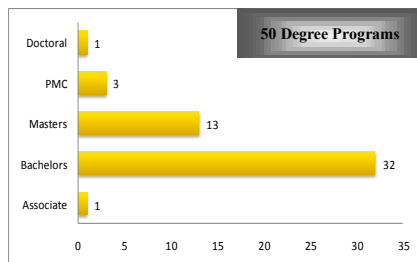
## Accreditation

According to the U.S. Department of Education, the goal of accreditation is to ensure that education provided by institutions of higher education meets acceptable levels of *quality*.

- \*The *University* is fully accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) Commission on Colleges
- \*The University offers degrees in **50** academic programs
  - \* 34 of the 50 academic programs are eligible for accreditation by specialized accrediting agencies
  - \* 100% of eligible academic programs are accredited by 13 different agencies

## Degree Programs

Grambling currently offers 50 degree programs at the following levels: 1 Associate, 32 Bachelors, 13 Master's, 3 Post Master's Certificate (PMC), and 1 Doctoral degree.



## Honoring Tradition

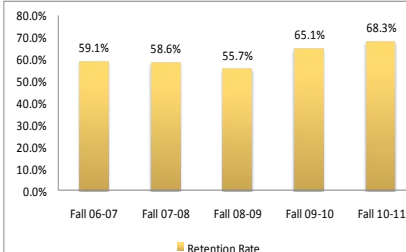

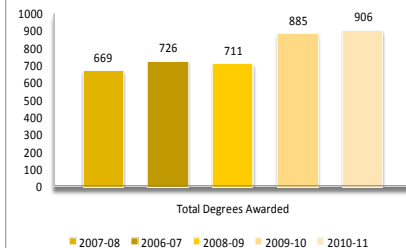
