

## Game Day Reminders For Residential Students

Due to the location of our various residence hall and apartments on campus, football game day celebrations and tailgating are practically in our backyard! We are always looking for ways to help keep our residents and facilities safe, so here are few things to keep in mind for home football games:**

- Most of our locations have open corridor and gated access; however, Residence halls are not open access for non-students without a student resident escort.
- During game days and special campus events, always be mindful of “suspicious” persons roaming your residence hall location. Remember-Our residence halls should only be accessible by residents of that particular hall.
- Please secure your room and your personal belongings at all times, and be sure to have your key(s) and Student ID Card on you. If you have a vehicle, make sure it is locked.
- Have a conversation with your roommates about visitors and reflect on current policy.
- Most of our locations have open corridor and gated access; however, staff members cannot let anyone into the living areas or into your individual room - this is for the safety of the residents who live in our residence hall community.
- The residence halls do not have restrooms open to the general public. Our restrooms are for current residents and their visitors/guests, only.
- The Zero Tolerance Expectations regarding drugs/alcohol/weapons/fighting is in effect at all times, including during football games. NO alcohol or alcohol containers are allowed in the residence halls, regardless of your age. You can find out more about the alcohol policy in the Student Handbook and Code of Conduct.
- As a GSU student, you will be held responsible for your behavior, so please act responsibly and represent the institution, accordingly!

**Football games are a very exciting time here, but please remember that the residence halls are first and foremost a home to our collegiate young women and young men. We know that sometimes football game weekends are the only time you get to see your family and friends, but we ask that along with your excitement, you help us maintain a safe and responsible environment for all of our residents.**
