

The personal safety of all students is our collective responsibility and priority. Housing & Residential Life encourages you to work with us to make this community a safe and enjoyable one.

Residents can maximize their personal security by remembering to proceed with caution in and around their living environment. We also ask that you put to practice the following:

- ✓ Be sure that the main entrance gate to your residence hall or apartment remains locked at all times. It is important to keep entry and exit gates closed when not in use! And never let anyone in that you don't know. Guest and visitors must sign in at the office.
- ✓ Most thefts in residence halls are crimes of opportunity. To protect yourself and your belongings, securely close and lock your room door (even if you are just running down the hall). Do not let strangers "tail-gate" into residence halls behind you when you enter through exterior doors and gates. Also, if you live in a first floor room, ensure your windows are locked and secured at all times.
- ✓ Familiarize yourself with the Emergency Call Boxes on campus. There are several of these Call Boxes located throughout the campus and they automatically dial campus police with the touch of a button. If you ever feel unsafe or witness a crime, use a call box or dial the police at 2222.
- ✓ The use, possession, display, or storage of any firearm, fireworks, illegal drugs, or alcohol in university owned or leased residence halls or apartment locations, are a clear violation of the Student Code of Conduct and is not permitted.
